Para tener en cuenta:

Las oraciones en el tiempo afirmativo llevan el verbo en **Pasado**.

Las oraciones en interrogativo utilizan el auxiliar **Did** (pasado de DO - DOES) y el verbo se escribe en tiempo presente.

Las oraciones en negativo, solo niegan con el auxiliar **Did** y el verbo se escribe en presente.

Las oraciones siguen estando en pasado, así el verbo se escriba en presente. El auxiliar **DID** es en este caso el que modifica el verbo, por eso así el verbo este en presente se puede leer en pasado.

Recuerda que para formar el pasado en los verbos irregulares solo agregas **ED**, y **los verbos irregulares cambian su escritura**.

Debes tener en cuenta también reglas para formar el pasado en los verbos regulares como: cambiar la (Y) por (i) y agregar (ed)

Si es una palabra monosílaba y termina en consonante, precedida de vocal...duplicar la consonante y agregar (ed)...etc.
