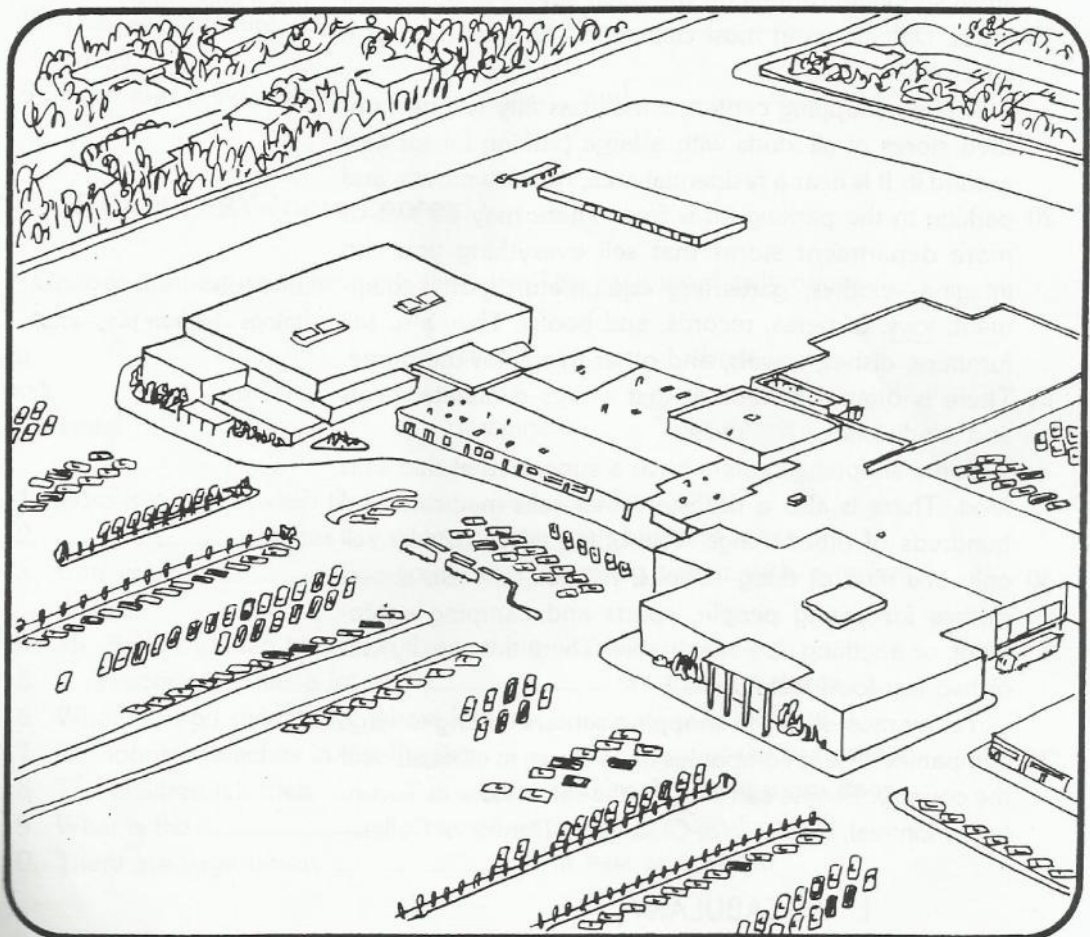

35 Today most stores in shopping centers belong to large companies. These companies have stores in cities all over the country. People can shop in the same store in Toronto or Montreal, in Boston or Chicago, in Denver or Dallas.
